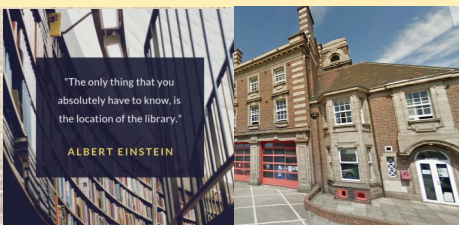

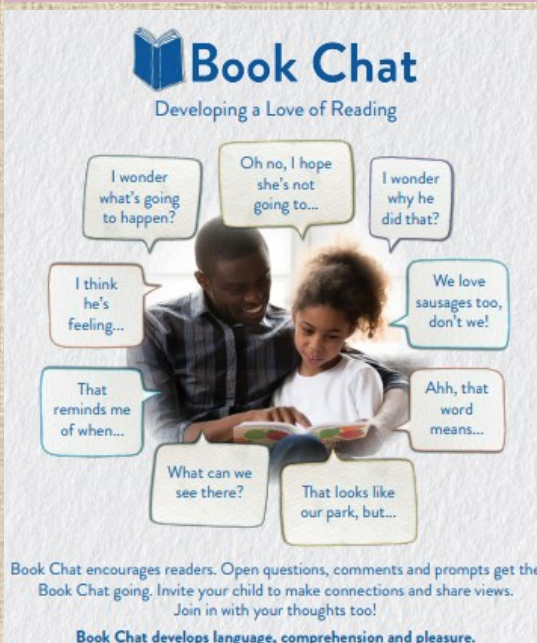
LIBRARY

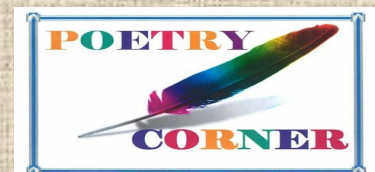


Book Chat

Book Chat develops language, comprehension and pleasure.

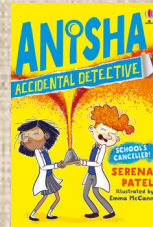
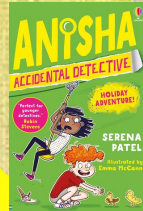
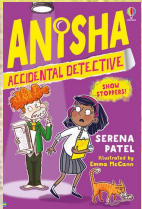
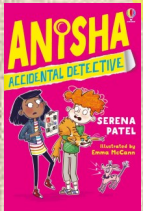

She lives in the West Midlands with her family and believes all children deserve to feel seen in the stories they read and that books are an important tool for empathy. When she's not writing Serena enjoys watching movies, reading and eating cake. Chocolate cake preferred.

Serena Patel was shortlisted for the Asian Writer Short Story Prize and finalist in the Undiscovered Voices Anthology 2018 and soon afterwards her debut children's series secured a multi-book contract with Usborne following a fiercely contested auction. She was diagnosed with ADHD as an adult.

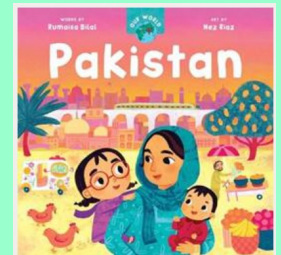

In this charming board book, a little girl takes the reader through her daily routine at home with her family in Pakistan.



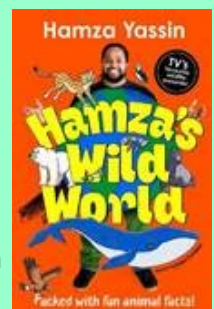
Leon: Worst Friends Forever by
