Key skills: To identify characters in a story.

Key skills: To follow the words of a story.

Continue to share books with your children, do they have a favourite story which is familiar to them?

When we read a story, we follow the words from left to right.

Can you follow the words in the story using your finger?

Key skill: To identify emotions in a story.

Can you choose your favourite storybook? Then choose one character from the story, how are they feeling? Were they happy, sad, angry, or worried?


Talk about why they felt that way. How did the other characters feel?

Key skill: To re-tell a simple story.

Can you read one of your favourite books, or a new book? What happened in the story?

Can you draw what happened in the story?

Key skill: To practise using writing tools.

Holding your pen using a comfortable grip to make marks and write letters from your name. You can support your child by writing letters from their name to copy. Support their letter formation.

Key skills: To listen to a story read by an adult.

Share a story with your child.

- Look at the pictures inside, name any objects they don't know the name of.
- What is happening in the pictures?

• Read the words to your child.

Talk about the book, what was their favourite part?

Key skills: To count up to 5 and up to 10 using number names in order.
