What will we be learning about this half term



What you could do at home

Follow a recipe at home.







What will we be learning about this half term

During this half term in Computing we are going to be developing our skills in Programming Animation. We will introduce Year 1 to ScratchJr, which will explore the way a project looks by investigation the animation and background.

Year 1 will learn the early stages of program design through the introduction of algorithms.

What you could do at home

Create a 'flip book' to create their story, which includes their own character, to make it look like it moves.

Reading and Phonics

What will we be learning about this half term

Visit the local library and share books to encourage reading for pleasure.

Writing

What will we be learning about this half term

This half term, children will revisit narrative writing with a focus on writing a story from a different culture. They then will move on to writing a non-chronological report and then poems.

What you could do at home

Practise writing simple sentences with adjectives, verbs, capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.

Write compound sentences using 'and'.

Practise writing common exception words and forming letters correctly.

Mathematics

What will we be learning about this half term:

This half term children will be learning to tell the time. They will focus on the hour and half past the hour, they will then lead into being able to measure and record an

activity. Following on from this we will be recognising money as well as progressing in our multiplication and division skills.

What you could do at home:

Discuss events with children that you are doing as a family. As you are going through your day, look at an analogue clock and recognise the timings as well as recognising the length of activity e.g half an hour, 1 hour, 2 hour etc

Music

What will we be learning about this half term:

During this half term our Music lessons are going to be focussing on exploring a variety of sounds. This will specifically be composing, sound design and graphic notation.

What you could do at home

Whilst at home you could create your own music using a variety of every day resources, either making music from this or building your very own musical instrument.



Physical Education

What will we be learning about this half term:

This half term we are completing an Athletics unit. In this unit we will be developing the skills that are required in athletics activities: running at different speeds, changing direction, jumping and throwing. Year 1 will be given opportunity to work collaboratively and competitively.

What you could do at home:

At home you could create an obstacle course perhaps in the garden or park to practice the skills of jumping over a variety of objects as well as changing the speeds. This will develop the skills of turn-taking and understanding that an obstacle requires a variety of skills.

What will we be learning about this half term

This half term, children will be learning all about how kind and unkind behaviour can affect others. Furthermore, they will be learning about the responsibilities they have inside and outside of the school.

What you could do at home

At home, children can explore the impact of our actions on the world. Talk to your child about the responsibilities they have as individuals on the world. Keywords
