

# DT

### What will we be learning about this half term

Children will be learning the principles of a healthy and varied diet-five portions of fruit and vegetables every day. They will identify where a range of fruit and vegetables come from. They will be reminded of the importance of washing their hands and keeping work surfaces clean.

Throughout this unit, children will have the opportunity to use simple tools with help to prepare food safely (a knife and knife skills- bridge method) to cut and slice and using a peeler to peel.) They will be preparing a dish that is healthy and contains a variety of food (design, make and evaluate.)

#### What you could do at home

Talk to children about the importance of washing their hands and keeping the surfaces clean.

Discuss with children what makes a balanced diet— children can design their own diets which are balanced and healthy

Practice cooking simple recipes with them at home!

# What will we be learning about this half term

We will be using a range of descriptive vocabulary to:

#### What you could do at home

Generate interesting adjectives with children by playing 'guess who'. You could use members of your family, celebrities or use clipart images of people. You must each describe a person and the other player will try to guess who it is based on the adjectives used. E.g. "She has <u>curly, long hair</u>"

Read regularly with your child at home so they are exposed to a variety of story types and vocabulary.

Encourage writing as much as possible. If you go to the park on the weekend, could children write a diary entry about their experience? Can they write a story about their favourite toy? Keywords

### What will we be learning about this half term

In this unit, pupils develop their understanding of the principles of striking and fielding games. They will develop the skills of throwing and catching, tracking, retrieving a ball and striking a ball. They begin to self-manage small-sided games. Pupils learn how to score points and play to the rules. Pupils will begin to think about how to use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition appropriate to the situation.

What you could do at home Encourage children to take part in a range of fitness activities to develop their positioning skills.

Encourage children to explore and develop their agility, balance, co-ordination, speed, and stamina by taking part in outdoor activities

such as football, rugby, badminton and tennis.
