Coronation of King Charles III

I am writing to inform you that we will be taking part in a range of activities to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III during the week 2nd-5th May.

Our main celebration will be a Coronation Lunch on Wednesday 3rd May. Children will have a special menu on this day and the hall will be decorated with balloons and bunting that the children will have made, either in breakfast club or at lunchtime.

On Wednesday 3rd May, children are invited to come to school wearing red, white and blue clothing. We would also like all the children to make a crown at home that they can wear on this day to help them celebrate.

Children will be asked to complete a research project about 'What is a coronation and how is it celebrated?' Examples could include: a fact file about the coronation based on research, a model/ drawing/ painting of something symbolic linked to the coronation such as the Sovereign's Sceptre/ Gold State Coach or information about how coronations are celebrated around the world. Children will need to bring these into school on Wednesday 3rd May.


